EWTN is celebrating one hundred years of Fatima. There will be new programming that looks back on the remarkable devotion. The centennial reminds us of the timelessness of the

Blessed Mother's message. EWTN will provide docudramas to cinematic presentations during the month of May and throughout most of the year, including an eight part docudrama, "THE MESSAGE OF FATIMA". Each of the eight episodes is devoted to a specific message of Fatima. The first episode will be produced on Wednesday, May 10th, after a special EWTN Live with Fr. Mitch Pacwa. May 7, 2017

During Easter time the church focuses on the Sacrament of Baptism, the foundation of faith, for the benefit of the newly baptized and the already baptized. In today's readings we learn that those who choose to be baptized put themselves under the care of the Good Shepherd. We take his selfless care and his patient suffering on the cross as a model for our own lives.

The composer of Psalm 23 uses the shepherd as an image for the Lord God, we naturally see Jesus as the Good Shepherd. We see the shepherd as a protector, nurture and gentle companion throughout Jesus' ministry. Jesus is always with us as a good Shepherd.

The Good Shepherd laid down his life for us. What can compare to God who loves us so much that he sent his only Son to rescue us from sin. In Peter's first sermon he spoke about Jesus-His miracles, how he was put to death, and how he rose from the dead for our salvation and for this he was crucified by our sinful ways. The people listening to Peter were remorseful and wanted to do something about this. Peter's message touched them to try harder to be pleasing to God.

The Gospel message helps us to think about our lives. It tells us that we have the hope of eternal life if we turn from sin and turn to Jesus.

In John 3:16 we read that "God so loved the world that he gave his only son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."
