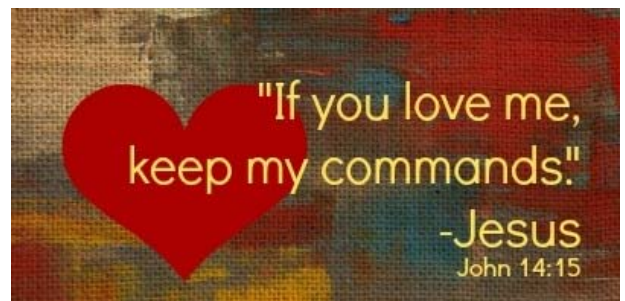

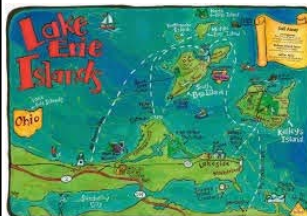

Open the eyes of my heart, Lord!

May 21, 2017

This week we continue with chapter 14 of Saint John's gospel where Jesus continues His farewell discourse. He explains to the disciples that He will send them an Advocate to remain with them always. Jesus says, "He would not leave you orphans." Through the Holy Spirit, He lives within us and us in Him.

In last week's gospel, Jesus told the disciples that if they believed in Him, that they would do the works that He has done. Saint Philip is the fulfillment of this promise. In last week's gospel, he was confused with Jesus' identity and His relationship with the Father. However, in this week's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, he shows extreme confidence and courage by going into Samaritan territory to spread the good news and performs miracles in Jesus' name. Witnessing Christ's passion and resurrection along with receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, transformed Saint Philip from questioning who Jesus was to fully embracing that He is Lord.

Saint Peter instructs us to Sanctify Christ as Lord of our hearts. He must be our first love. We need to dedicate our lives to pleasing Him by keeping His commandments. Our actions should reflect His kindness, peacefulness, patience, generosity and love. Saint Philip's attitude changed based on what he experienced. We must allow our participation in the Eucharist and the gifts of the Holy Spirit we received at our Confirmation to transform us into being confident believers in the promises of Jesus. There should be no doubt in people's minds that our hope is in Christ our Savior. We must boldly confess that Jesus is Lord.
