- » **Joy**—We live with joy when we recognize that true happiness comes, not from money or possessions, but from knowing and following Christ.
- » **Peace**—We are freed from worrying about trivial things because of the inner peace we experience with God in our hearts. We work and pray for peace throughout the world.
- » **Patience**—We demonstrate patience by treating others with thoughtfulness and tolerance. We know that we can overcome the temptations and sufferings of life because God is always with us.
- » **Kindness**—We live the virtue of kindness by treating others as we want to be treated.
- » **Goodness**—We exhibit goodness when we honor God by avoiding sin and always trying to do what we know is right.
- » **Generosity**—We demonstrate the fruit of generosity when we share our gifts and possessions with others.
- » **Gentleness**—Gentle people act calmly and avoid actions that might lead others to anger or resentment.
- » **Faithfulness**—We are faithful when we live out our commitment to the teachings of Jesus, the Scriptures, and the Catholic Church.
- » **Modesty**—We exhibit modesty by being pure in our thoughts, words, and dress.
- » **Self-control**—We exercise self-control by working to overcome the temptations we face and by trying always to do God's will.
- » **Chastity**—We live the virtue of chastity when we use the gift of sexuality wisely, according to God's plan.

One of the contrasting behaviors of the Spirit is gossip! Pope Francis talked about gossip in a visit to a parish in Rome a couple of weeks ago during the Easter season. He said in his homily:

"Excuse me if I always return to this, but I think that this is the enemy that destroys our communities: gossip. Perhaps it will be good for you, some today, some on another day, when you go to greet Our Lady, to look downwards and see that tongue [of the snake] and say to Our Lady, "Our Lady, save me: I do not want to be like this. I want to conserve the Holy Spirit as you conserved Him". She conserved the Spirit, Who then came and made her Mother of the Son of God. Sisters and brothers, truly: this hurts my heart, it is as if we threw stones at each other. And the devil enjoys this: it is a carnival for the devil, this! Let us ask for this grace: to conserve the Holy Spirit that is in us. Do not grieve Him, as the Apostle tells us. Do not grieve Him. And may our attitude to all – Christians and non Christians – be an attitude of gentleness and respect, so that the Holy Spirit may act in this way with us: with gentleness and respect."

Let us build up our communities by living in the fruits of the Holy Spirit! Come Holy Spirit!

*Open the eyes of
my heart, Lord!*

Those poor confused Apostles. Their lots seem to change every day and now Jesus has left them again. It's not like He didn't tell them this would happen. They have been told all along just what to expect. But there they are, staring at the sky. I certainly can't blame them, that's what I would be doing as well. It took a special visit from two angels to get them moving again, to re-explain that Jesus has been taken up into heaven and it's time for them to move on. It is time to prepare for the next step, the sending of the Holy Spirit so that they will know what to say, what to do, and where to go to spread the good news. But none of this will happen if they just stand there. They must get ready.

I know that beginning a new project can be extraordinarily difficult. Sometimes we are just procrastinating, and sometimes the whole project looms before us like an unclimbable mountain. Essentially for the Apostles, their new life as bearers of the Word, as preachers of the Good News, is before them and it looks like an unclimbable mountain. But even this Jesus spoke to them about. He told them He would send an advocate – the Spirit – to get them on their path. We have received the same message. We receive it every Sunday at the closing of the Mass. We are sent. Often we hear only "The Mass is ended, go in peace," but sometimes this can be followed with "to love and serve the Lord." Or even better, the clearer message of "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." This is an instruction for our lives just as the Apostles received this instruction. The difference is that we, through the Sacrament of Confirmation, have already received the Spirit. It is now time to act. No excuses.

- I am expected to prepare for mass in several ways. The first one, of course, is to prepare to receive the Eucharist by fasting. The second would be to read the scriptures prior to my attendance in order to put myself in the right frame of mind for the experience and the hearing of the message. Some of us have other things we add to our pre-mass preparation. How do I prepare for mass and in what ways can I improve this? What am I missing in my preparation?
- During the mass, I am told clearly what I am expected to do – love and serve the Lord. I also may hear a message in the homily that I need to embrace and use to make changes in my life. And of course, I am dismissed to "announce the Gospel of the Lord." At the end of mass, do I sit a moment and think about these messages? How can I make time for this pondering of my instructions?
- Now, I have left the mass. Am I running off to my next event without really finishing the previous celebration? When can I take a moment to consider my calling? What was I just asked to do? In what way will I "love and serve the Lord," or "go and announce the Gospel of the Lord?"

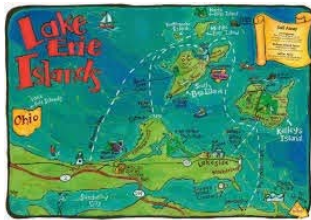
