In Romans 8:11, Paul declares: "The same power that raised Christ from the dead is living in you." When we make the Sign of the Cross, we think about God as a communion of love between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God shows his overflowing love for us in Jesus and invites us to share in his love through the power of the Spirit. All liturgies profess the belief in the Triune God. Jesus' death and resurrection prompted a new birth in the Holy Spirit. In the earlier scenes of John's Gospel, Jesus overturned the temple money-changers which was a observance in Judaism. They were there in the temple areas to provide the necessary change for people to pay their pledge to the temple so that "public offerings might be made that atone for Israel's sins. Jesus' action signaled the rejection of prior temple worship with something new.

He offers a new worship – a worship in the Spirit. Jesus is stressing the necessity of spiritual rebirth. By Christ's becoming human and dying, rising and ascending to the throne of glory are able to be born anew in the Spirit. It is a free and beautiful gift! On this feast of the Trinity, the feast that celebrates our life in the fullness of God, I am reminded that I am privileged to share joyful mystery. Last Sunday was "Pentecost" and next Sunday is the "Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ" (Corpus Christi.) These are beautiful celebrations in our faith. I may wish to ask myself, in what way do these Solemnity celebrations of faith challenge me in my every day life?
