

*...I say to you,  
 unless you eat the Flesh of the Son of Man and drink  
 his Blood,  
 you do not have life within you.  
 Whoever eats my Flesh and drinks my Blood  
 has eternal life,  
 and I will raise him on the last day.  
 For my Flesh is true food,  
 and my Blood is true drink.  
 Whoever eats my Flesh and drinks my Blood  
 remains in me and I in him.  
 Just as the living Father sent me  
 and I have life because of the Father,  
 so also the one who feeds on me will have life because  
 of me.  
 This is the bread that came down from heaven.  
 Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died,  
 whoever eats this bread will live forever."  
 These things he said while teaching in the synagogue  
 in Capernaum.*

Today we celebrate the gift of the Holy Eucharist. We read from the sixth chapter of John's gospel in which Jesus says that the bread is real food and the cup is real drink. The Eucharist is truly the body and blood of Christ! In the Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass, the priest prays over the cup filled with wine that is to become Christ's blood:

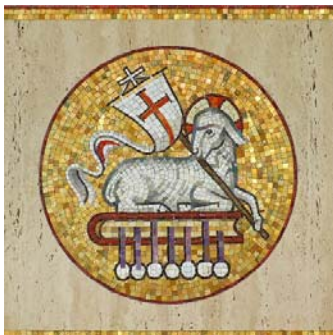
Accipite et bibite ex eo omnes:

 peccatorum.

this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and  
 everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for many  
 so that sins may be forgiven.

Hoc facite in meam commemorationem  
 Do this in memory of me.

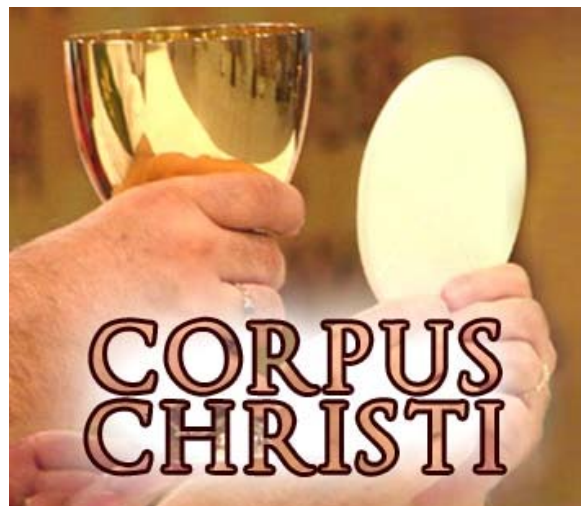

The Catholic bishops of the world are planning to meet in October 2018 for the 15th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. The theme of this gathering is "Youth, Faith and Vocational Discernment." In preparation for this major synod on youth, Pope Francis wants to gather input from the Catholic faithful. Consequently, the Diocese of Cleveland has made available a survey questionnaire to gather information on the current state of the young in our diocese that will be included as part of the pre-synod discernment document.

The bishops of the United States pray that the results of this survey will help them more fully understand the experience of young people in our Church and in our country -- their hopes, dreams, fears and struggles -- so that the synod may bear fruit in offering more insight and direction to our ministry with young people.

Our blood lineage is passed down generation after generation through parents and grandparents so we can say that we are children of our relatives. We can be called children of God because Jesus passed down His Body and Blood through the Miracle of the Consecration of bread and wine each time we receive Communion. Through this miracle we have Jesus within us.

All our readings today tells us that the Eucharist is the intimate way Jesus offers to us His life in us and thus bind us to Him and one another. His statement, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life within you," was hard for the Jews to accept. They thought he was talking about cannibalism. Jesus was talking about the miracle of the Eucharist and the life that we receive in us. The fullness of life belongs to them who experience fully and actively Christ in the Eucharist.

In the second reading we see how God cared for the Israelites wandering in the desert with nourishment. The real nourishment was his word proclaimed to them by Moses and the giving of the Ten Commandments - words to live by. Moses wanted the Israelites to know that their nourishment comes from God's words. With his word we will be filled with the love of God and the promise of eternal life. Today, through the Eucharist, God gives himself to us, to live in us and bind us to him and to one another. Paul uses the Exodus story to highlight the enormity of the gift that Christians receive in the Eucharist.

Today, as we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, let's thank Jesus for this great and wonderful gift - His Body and Blood. Let's keep our eyes and our hearts open as we witness the Eucharistic miracle take place on the altar of our Church.

These words of Christ are prayed over the chalice that contains the wine that will become the blood of Christ, we remember that his blood was shed on the cross to forgive our sins. Each time we come to this table we are in need of mercy. We must remember that we are sinners yet loved!

As Jesus looked deeply into the souls of those who were at table with him at that Last Supper, he was moved with mercy. Each one of them was a friend, a disciple, who loved him and their common unity was Him. But each of them in some way would betray him, would sin, at his hour of greatest need.

For each of them to rise with Him they had to receive his mercy and forgiveness. For each them to be the Church they too had to extend this mercy. For them to ultimately reach their destiny with Him in eternal life that had to be filled with the Spirit of mercy and forgiveness.

As we celebrate Christ's death and resurrection today and every Sunday at the Eucharist, it is our prayer that we be filled with mercy.

We need to open our souls to Christ as he desires communion with us and thirsts for our love. Even as important we must forgive ourselves for all of our failures and weaknesses. And further! We must reach out in mercy and grace to those who have hurt us. If we don't, then we cannot pass over from death to life. The Spirit is offered this night to empower us to be lifted up in mercy.

It is up to us to choose this power and mercy as we come to his most sacred table of forgiveness.

Friday is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Join us for the Eucharist at 8:30 am and after Mass we will pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart. It is also a day we ask God to bless our priests and bishops.

Thanks to all of you who responded so well to our Mass schedule change last weekend. Change is difficult at times but last weekend expressed your fidelity to the Eucharist and our great parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe.
