

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The following is a message from Bp. Nelson Perez:

Today we will be taking up a second collection in support of the victims of Hurricane Harvey.

The Catholic Diocese of Cleveland and dioceses across the country have been asked by the leadership of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to have an emergency collection to assist these victims.

Over the past several days, all of us have been following the historic flooding in southeast Texas. Hurricane Harvey has created an unprecedented and catastrophic weather event of immense proportions. The hurricane may now, quite possibly, also strike Louisiana. Catholic Charities USA has conveyed that, along with Category 4 hurricane winds, 14-28 inches of rain fell in the Houston area on Saturday night alone. In some areas, it is anticipated that a total of 50 inches will fall, as the rains are expected to continue for at least another two days. Twelve million persons were under a flash flood warning over the weekend. Rivers will be rising and will be at historic flood stages for some time.

This emergency collection will be used both to support the humanitarian and recovery efforts of Catholic Charities USA and to provide pastoral and rebuilding support to impacted dioceses through the USCCB.

Faith prompts us to share what we've been given with others, through direct teaching, or simply as a companion on the path of life. Today's readings remind us of our shared responsibility in humanity's journey to holiness. In the first reading, God appoints Ezekiel to be a sentry or lookout for Israel. Ezekiel is told that his destiny depends on the energy he puts into convincing people to change their wicked ways, whether or not they repent.

Just as God appointed Ezekiel as a watchman for the house of Israel so he has appointed us to watch over our own house and family. How can we be watchman for our family? We can do this by intercessory prayer. In the “Word Among Us” magazine, it tells us to pray for our family and mention each by name and be specific about the intention you are praying for. There are limits to our influence, but there is no limit to the power of prayer!

Conversion is only possible if our hearts are open to hear God's voice. In the Responsorial Psalm, the phrase “hardened hearts” is an allusion to the Israelites' grumbling against God during their Exodus journey. In the Second Journey, Paul argues that observing God's Commandments is shared responsibility. Paul summarizes the Commandments in a single command - love one another in word and deed.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus provided us with step-by-step directions for calling people to return to the community of faith. The ones who have been wronged are directed to use every means possible to bring back the wayward. God wants all of us to be looking out for each other.

“Lord, protect and guide my family. Bless them and protect them from evil. Fill them with your peace and your love.”
