**October 1, 2017**

Whenever I read today's passages, I think of kids. Just the phrase "It's not fair!" says it all. When I follow this with the passage from Matthew about the two sons each tasked with the same job, it's hard for me not to think of my sons when they were younger. Because of this, my grandson and I discussed the "It's not fair," and the two boys. When we were finished, I no longer understood the passages! Kids say the darndest things.

He explained (he's six) that he will just keep trying to get what he wants until he gets it. That's how he handles what he sees as not fair. As far as the two boys, he believes he is the first boy and that he might say no, but would do the job anyway. I then got a long list of things his cousin same age does wrong. Not quite where I was going. So, back to the drawing board. We judge others by our own standards. If someone does not do something the way we think he or she should, then that person has done it incorrectly. If they then get praised, it just isn't fair – even though it was perfectly proper, just different. With Matthew, I wonder why the first son gets away with his comment. I would not have gotten away with that! The result would have probably been a swat and my brother being told he had to help me, resulting in an outburst from my brother and two crabby kids out pruning the vines. The job would get done, but dad might still be miffed at us, and we might still be sullen. As it happens, I had no brothers, but my sisters and I were all expected to do what we were told and not permitted to say no. Invariably, no matter what went before, we would be singing and laughing before we were done with the task.

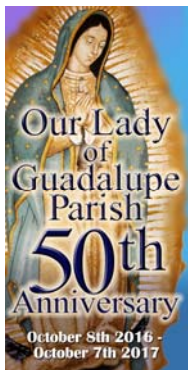
So what does this tell us? As hard as it is for me – a perfectionist who wants things done her way – to understand, my ways are not God's ways. God is in the love and forgiveness business and humans may try, but we do not always get it right. We know what is expected of us, but we do what we want. Jesus is saying to the chief priests and the elders that sinners heard the message from John and from Him, repented, changed their ways and can enter the kingdom of heaven. Why can't they hear the message and upon hearing the good news, follow those sinners and enter the kingdom of heaven themselves?

This week I and a group I was with all grew angry with another person for not doing what we considered right. No harm came to us from this, but boy were we angry. What good did this do us? What did it teach anyone who heard us?

Reflect: Has this happened to me, and how did I react? How could I have improved my reaction? Did I publicize my anger on Facebook for all to see? Or did I put things into perspective?

When was the last time things just did not seem fair? What did I do about it? Did I try to understand, or did I rant and rave? How could I grow from this?
