

A couple of weeks ago Fr. Kevin approached me and asked me if I would consider being the Advocate for the sick of the parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I was very surprised that Father would ask me to do that. I told Fr. Kevin that I would be happy to take up that mission. Father told me that I had been under his watchful eye for about a year and a half while I was doing communion calls for the sick in their homes, hospitals, nursing homes and rehab centers as needed. I also did communion calls under Fr. Joe Lehane and Fr. David Trask our former pastors. This ministry has gone on for the last twenty years as a silent ministry. Fr. Kevin has chosen to make it more of a public ministry. But we will still protect the privacy of the sick of the parish. So it will still be somewhat of a private ministry. If any member of Our Lady of Guadalupe is in need of the sacraments of anointing or the Eucharist or both, you need to call the parish office with that information which will be passed on to me to coordinate and I will return your call.

Regular communion calls are on the First Friday of the month for the home bound of the parish. Others who are in a local nursing home, or rehab center, or a hospital will be taken to on an as needed basis. If their confinement is on a long term basis, a schedule will be made to visit that person. I will be under the supervision of Fr. Kevin and report to him on a regular basis as to what I am doing for the sick and ill of the parish. I will also be working with Deacon Dave and Nancy Freibott our pastoral minister. We will make changes along the way if necessary in order to better serve the sick of our parish.

It's been an honor to serve the individuals I have served in this ministry and look forward to serving many more of the parish. I thank God for this ministry he has given to me and all the graces God has shed on me. To do His will in my life. I do not wish for anyone to become sick or ill but, if you do by the grace and direction of God's will, we in this ministry of the sick and as Advocate, your families will be taken care of.

The number one complaint I hear from the sick is that they feel isolated and maybe even abandoned by the church and their families because they are sick and lonely. I feel this ministry can bridge this gap and make the sick feel loved and appreciated.

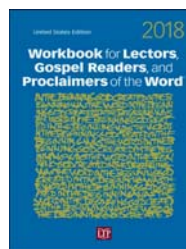
CHOIR NEWS

Most of us can probably relate with the priests who showed favoritism in the first reading from the prophet Malachi. It is human nature to want to belong to or be associated with a group. This along with our pride allows us to treat people differently based on our relationship with that individual or group. We have the tendency to cater to people of influence, friends or people of the same race or creed. This allows us to have at best double standards and at its worst hatred.

In today's Gospel and our Second reading we hear a message of love and humility. Jesus tells us we need to humble ourselves, if we want to have a place on honor. Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians tells us to treat others with affection and gentleness. We need to work diligently in spreading the gospel to all peoples, sharing God's love with whomever we encounter. This includes tenderly holding everyone to the same standards of truth, whether it is a family member or someone totally different than us.

This call, to counter our natural human instincts, can only be accomplished through faith. It is when we trust and follow Jesus's example and invite the Holy Spirit to guide us, that the impossible can be achieved. Both Saint Paul and the prophet Malachi instruct us that we all have the same father in Heaven. We are all family in God's eyes. The Responsorial Psalm tells the whole story. "In you, Lord, I have found my peace." It is only through Jesus, that we will have lasting peace in our lives. Peace that allows us to look and treat everyone as a family member.
