Here is some background on MMM:

The Medical Missionaries of Mary are an international missionary congregation of Catholic women religious. We were founded by Marie Martin in Nigeria in 1937 to bring the love of God to others through a service of healing. We are also known by our official initials: MMM.

We follow Christ, who "went about doing good", healing the sick and proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom. We live "that all may have life and have it in its fullness". Our charism (spiritual gift to be used for the community) as medical missionaries places us in the world of health and medicine, for the service of the universal Church. We serve preferentially in missionary situations where the need for human development is great and the people are awaiting the liberating and healing power of the Gospel.

Medical Missionaries of Mary make public lifelong profession of vows of chastity, poverty and obedience lived in community. The Gospel is the basis for our lives. Like Mary, the model of the Church, we are called to be contemplatives who are active in the world.

At present there are about four hundred members from nineteen countries. We work in fourteen countries in Africa, Europe and the Americas.

Our motto is: "Rooted and Founded in Love" (Eph 3:17).

Our Motherhouse is in Drogheda, Ireland. Our MMM administrative headquarters is at our Congregational Centre in Dublin, where members of our Congregational Leadership Team and other staff reside.

Open the eyes of my heart, Lord!

July 14, 2019

In today's Gospel reading, Christ offers a parable in response to the question a scholar of the law asked: "But who is my neighbor?" In Christ's time, Jews considered Samaritans their enemies. The "good" Samaritan tends the man's wounds, finds him lodging and pays for it. All this with an act of compassion! An unthinkable act, the Samaritan "loves" the stranger as his neighbor. The Samaritan in this parable was righteous by his actions. He was living biblical justice. All are equal before the eyes of God. All are deserving the same love that God gives to all people. To be a disciple means we are to love as Jesus loves and there is no deserving or undeserving love. All are deserving in the eyes of God. Sometimes this is a challenge for us to conceive.

The first and second readings implicate for us to love as God loves and the wisdom of God who is incarnate in the person of Jesus Christ, brings us "shalom peace."

Jesus leaves us with this challenge – to stretch beyond what is expected of us and work towards respect and dignity for all those whom we encounter. Not judging our "neighbor" on how they look, dress, lifestyle or actions. Remember, the peasant Jew, the Pharisee, the Sadducee, the priest, the Levite they were all shaken up by the parable and its unexpected outcome. They were all stretched!

How am I going to respond; especially this week, to the challenge of today's gospel both within my community and within myself personally.

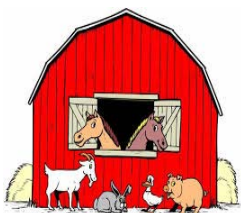

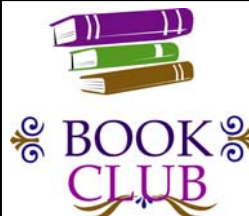

Just as we did last summer, the OLG Book Discussion Group will be taking July and August off. During the summer anyone interested in joining us, as well as our current members, will each choose a book or books to read that are of a spiritual nature, or which delve into our faith from some other aspect. When we return in September we will share what we have learned and perhaps choose a group read from these sources. **Our next meeting will be at 7:00 PM in the Marian Room on September 5th.**

Another topic of discussion for September will be ideas for future meetings. Suggestions so far were to look at sources recommended by the FORMED project as well as books for faith formation.

Children's Liturgy of the Word Every Sunday at 10:30 am Mass, for children age 3- 2nd grade Family Connection: Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Families rely on selfless love. Parents show love for their children not just when it's convenient, but whenever their children's needs must be met. Imagine if the members of a family were concerned only with their own needs. How quickly things would fall apart!

In the story of the Good Samaritan, we learn about someone who went out of his way to care for the needs of another. He recognized the victim as his brother and accepted responsibility for him. As a family, talk about the responsibilities of each member of the family. Share how you, as parents, care for the needs of everyone in the family even when it's inconvenient. Ask your children to share times when they did chores and helped the family even when it was not convenient.

Talk about how the Samaritan went out of his way to care for the needs of the victim. Make a commitment as a family to follow the example of the Good Samaritan. Explain that the more you learn to accept responsibility for each other's needs at home, the more you'll be able to accept responsibility for the needs of others in the world.
