Dear Friends,

There have been so many things written about and preached on relating to matters of life that hasn't already been said. So unfortunately, I will not have anything ground shaking to write.

Pope Francis has recently stated that with all the conflict going on in the world, we need to "accompany" our brothers and sisters in their life's journey in their sufferings and struggles rather than marginalize them or villainize them.

When you hear, "Pro-Life" or "Life Matters," we tend to have this contempt because of our familiarity and we immediately think "What else can be said or be done regarding these issues that we haven't already done?" We have the issue of abortion at the beginning of life and euthanasia at the end of life. We have the scourge of the Death Penalty for those that are in prison and have committed serious crimes. But "Life Matters" also relate to our relationship with others who lead a lifestyle different than ours, in particular the LGBTQ community. We as Catholics know that lifestyle is in direct conflict with Church teaching and so we tend to villainize and isolate individuals that are apart of that community.

It's easy to cast aside the LGBTQ community and villainize them when we don't know anyone in our family or personal sphere of influence who is LGBTQ. But when a family member, son, daughter, niece, nephew, "come out," then it becomes real. The person we hated for their "choice" is now someone we love.

I personally don't know the answer to reconcile the person we love with what the Church teaches and what we believe, but hatred is not the answer. When we accompany somebody, we don't always agree or even like each other but, we do love each other as a child of God and respect them as one of God's creations and we continue the conversation rather than end it with shouting, insults and isolation.

So we pray for an end to the sin and scourge of abortion. We pray for an end to euthanasia and the blatant disregard for people and all the judgement that resides in our hearts for people we consider unredeemable. And we pray for a healing of the hate on both sides of the LGBTQ issues.

So let us accompany each other with respect and love in our hearts as Jesus has for each and every one of us.



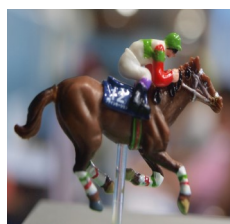

God bless everyone at both of our parishes, Our Lady of Guadalupe and Cosmas and Damian.

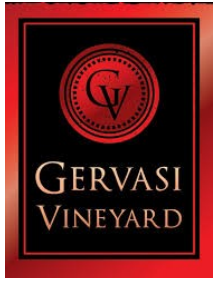
