Open the eyes of my heart, Lord!

July 12, 2020

In today's Gospel of Matthew, it is the first of his parables. It is a simple parable for ordinary people of Jesus' community of Galilean farmers. As in all parables, there is a "catch" to get their attention. No one would plant seeds on rocky soil or in weeds! The surprise comes when the farmers hear how large the harvest was that fell on good soil! This seed would produce three times as much as the farmers would have expected a good crop to produce.

The seed is the good news of God's reign. This is the heart of Jesus' preaching mission. They will either hear and accept or hear and reject the message. Later the disciples approach Jesus and ask him why he teaches in parables. Parables are not difficult unless the heart is already stony and unresponsive. Jesus' works were not hidden; yet Israel did not believe. In other words, the reason for the failure of the seed is the spiritual state of the hearer's heart or lack of. "The Sower is the Lord of the Harvest." Other reasons for the failure of the seed of God's word to take root are the lack of spiritual insight, lack of endurance in life, everyday worries of life and the enticement of wealth. The state of the hearer's heart! Those who choose to accept Jesus and his teachings are greater than all the prophets before them. They will go out and bring others into the reign of God. They will be the new harvesters! Hope for humanity and all of creation in the midst of our difficult situations. After all, in Genesis, the first human is created out of soil and the Word Adam can be translated as an "earthling."

How does your original understanding of this gospel compare with what I just read? Were there any new insights for me? How has this reading and understanding stretched, challenged or affirmed me?
