We hear today the meeting of Jesus and the Canaanite woman:

Then Jesus said to her in reply,  
 "O woman, great is your faith!  
 Let it be done for you as you wish."  
 And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour.

It seems at first hearing that Jesus is rude to the desperate Canaanite woman. Sometimes we have been rude to beggars, strangers, and the brazen. But in this case, Jesus is prompting faith. Jesus knew her heart. She was a Gentile and not of his company. He accepts and includes her. Jesus calls her a dog! She still implores his mercy: "The dogs eat scraps," she exclaimed! This response caused a response by the Lord. A deep relationship was established. Healing and mercy flowed forth from the hearts in union.

All too often when strangers come into our path, we ignore and separate. We call them worse than dogs. But strangers and beggars can be gifts to elicit faith and new relationships.

Today we are to combat racism not by violence or even words. We can enter into the lives of people with different color, language, and culture by simply being tolerant and recognizing through the experience of Jesus and the Canaanite woman that we are sisters and brothers.



This weekend, we welcome into the church four individuals that are excited to be fully initiated into the Catholic faith. As I met with them in our preparation classes, I was encouraged by their desire and yearning to understand and accept the gifts of the Holy Spirit that will be bestowed on them as Father Kevin anoints them with the Chrism oils. **MASKS DURING MASS**

Many parishes have reported concerns over parishioners who have returned to the celebration of parish Masses, yet refuse to wear masks or face shields. Some of these individuals cite "civil liberties" as the reason for their refusal. Please be mindful that the health and physical well-being of our brothers and sisters in Christ is under threat. Wearing masks and/or face shields during a pandemic is an action taken out of love for neighbor, the second of the two Great Commandments. "In the celebration of Mass the faithful form a holy people,...so that they may give thanks to God and...so that they may learn to offer their very selves. They should, moreover, take care to show this by their...charity toward brothers and sisters who participate with them in the same celebration. They are consequently to avoid any appearance of singularity or division." (GIRM, no. 95) Wearing masks or face shields.

**August 16, 2020**

All of today's readings tell us that God's salvation is meant for everyone. In the beginning, all of Jesus' followers were Jewish. But as Gentiles came to believe in the Lord, the Jewish Christians began to understand that God's plan of salvation was far bigger than they had expected. It must have been hard for the Jewish people to accept Gentiles living, praying and working alongside them. The Jewish people thought the Gentiles to be unclean.

In today's Gospel, we are shown an example of intercessory prayer as the Canaanite woman is persistent and undeterred by challenges as she presents her daughter's need for healing to Jesus.

Matthew writes that Jesus first turns down the woman because of her ethnicity and then insults her by calling her a dog. But then he responds to her faith and the story ends with salvation extended beyond Israel without denying Israel's priority. Jesus shows his acceptance and care for all people even Gentiles.

Who are the people you have a hard time accepting? Are you willing to lift them up in prayer? Let them know you care about them by your acceptance.

## EUCCHARISTIC PROCESSION

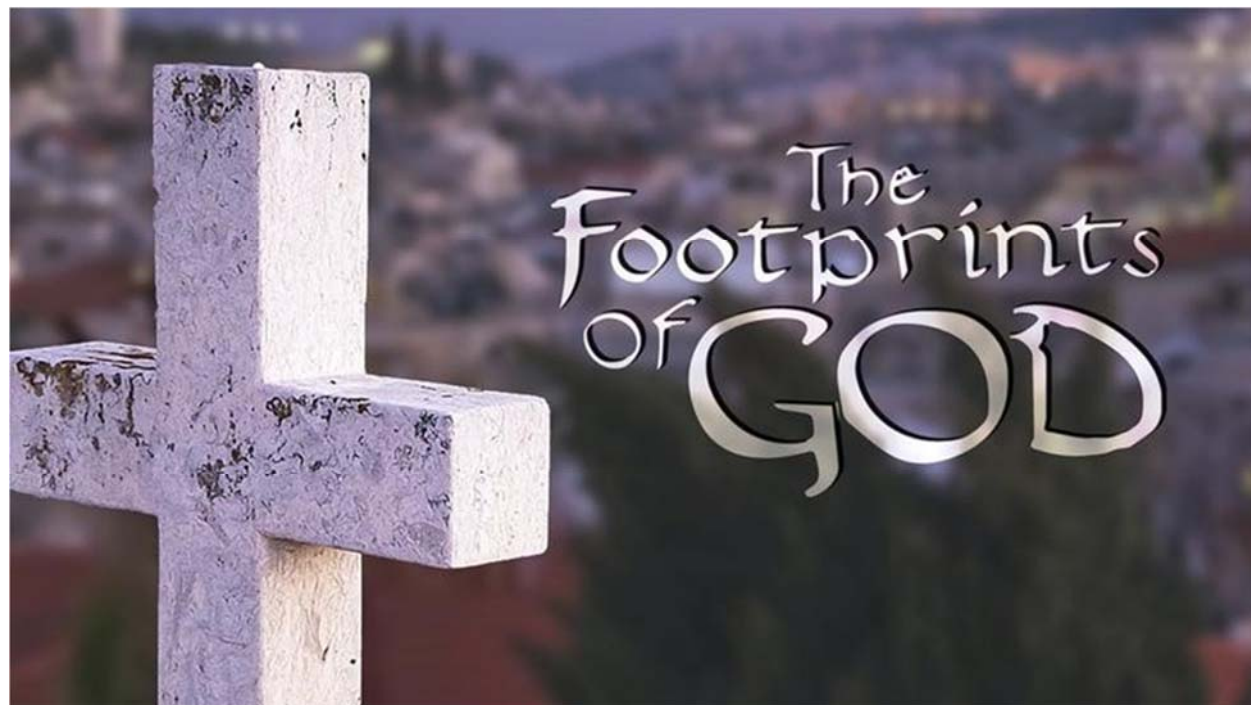
