

Should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. (Luke 12: 35-40)

Dear Friends,

Yet another theme emerges from the gospel of Luke: Rest and communion with God!

In my experience, and the experience of the Church, the time of the day most prone to temptation and to sin, the time we need the most protection, and may lose our way, is the second and third watch mentioned by Jesus in the gospel. This is the time between 9 pm and 3 am. This is the time of night when most of the time we should be home and resting! Night time if spent awake can lead us astray. The night can bring confusion, despair and chaos.

Many watch tv during this time. Others go to the internet. Still others go out of the home looking for trouble! Some have to work and others are taking care of children and elderly. It is best to rest during this time, remaining still, and faithful. This is practical advice from Christ.

I would suggest resting at these times, staying at home. Monks know the dangers of the night and obediently go to their rooms in silence during the second and third watch. We do not need this extreme, but good counsel to focus on prayer, sleep, and family during these crucial times.

Of course temptation and sin can come at any time. But, the night should be spent in communion with God! We need at least eight hours of sleep and rest brings less anxiety, which can lead to peace and accomplishment. The time between 9 pm and dawn is a good time for recreating our spirit. We are blessed to heed this advice and guidance from the Lord Jesus.

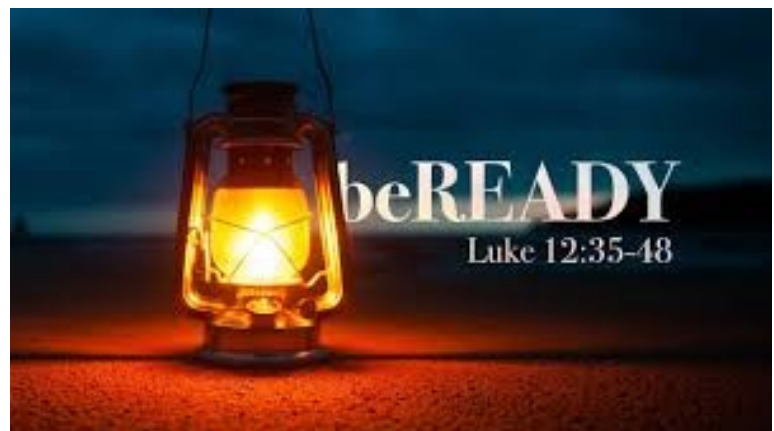
