Welcome to Lent!

Every year we are called to a renewal of mind, heart and spirit. We call this renewal, **Lent**, a time to put on in a more concentrated way the "*good works*" of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These three "*pillars*" of Lent draw us into a deeper understanding of who we are; that is, a baptized and faithful follower of the Lord. They urge us to repent and return, to reconcile and renew ourselves once again in the spirit of Christ!

These are the "pillars" that guide us in the Holy Season of Lent:

Fasting

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday: How do we fast? When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
Abstinence is for those 14 years and older from meat on Fridays.

Giving alms

Two primary ways here at our parish. **Blessing Bags** are our parish Lenten Project: Blessing Bags are goods collected and distributed to the Peter Maurin, VA Hospital and Battered Women Shelter. Contributions are made to Ministry for Those in Need along with the






