

Dear Friends,

Welcome to all who are visiting to see the live performance of **Tetelestai!** This weekend is unique to our parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe because some of our parishioners are participating. God bless you for coming. God bless the cast, support staff, and volunteers who make the show possible. I hope all parishioners take the time to see and pray for the show. Performances are at 8 pm Friday, 8 pm Saturday, and 2 pm Sunday here in the Church.

On these third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, we, the baptized, are drawn ever deeper into the mystery of Christ through the gospel of John and Eucharist. We "put on Christ" at our baptism. He is the living water illustrated last Sunday in the gospel as Jesus meets the samaritan woman at the well. Today Jesus is the Light as he heals **the man born blind.** Over time our faith should deepen. But the reality is sin sometimes overtakes us. We like the man born blind, find ourselves in darkness. The time is now to see Christ. He can take away our sin and darkness.

This healing (John 9) is the sixth sign revealing Christ in John's gospel. The blind one is an icon of all of us. All of us need illumination by Christ to see the glory of God and our sins that blind us to his glory. This sign is directly related to baptism, also called *holy illumination*. (The Orthodox Study Bible, p. 1442)

Jesus directly tells us that man born blind provided an opportunity to reveal God. When presented to Christ, our sickness, disease, and even sins can reveal the splendor of salvation.

May we allow Christ to anoint our eyes, bodies, and spirits with the same clay he touched the man. May we wash not in the pool of Siloam but in his living water of baptism.

A reminder! The stations of the cross are Friday at 7 pm. Confessions are 5.30 pm- 730 pm on Mondays and following the 4.30 pm vigil Mass on Saturdays. Prayers.
