

Dear Friends,

Today I am grateful to the Father for 40 years of priestly ministry. Thank you for your presence at the Eucharist this Holy Sunday!

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our life in the Church. In the gospel today Jesus teaches He is the living bread on our journey to the Father. Along with Chapter 6 of John's gospel, I am inspired by another text describing the Eucharist by Luke Chapter 24, in which Jesus, after he rose from the dead, accompanied Cleopas and his companion to Emmaus. I am a priest and good shepherd for you. We together are companions not to Emmaus but into the heart of Jesus, where one day we live forever. I remain a priest because of this hope. Jesus is bread broken on the altar. One day we will eat and drink in his kingdom.

You present are my companions on the journey, and I give great thanks.

On Monday our young continue their Mission Mondays. Last week, I celebrated Mass for them and shared in their reflections on their service in our area communities.

There are no Monday evening Masses during the summer. Weekday Masses are at noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The Masses on Monday will continue in September when the PSR children return to study and pray.




The Liturgy of The Word




