

Dear Friends.

Thank you so much for honoring my fortieth-anniversary of priesthood last Sunday. Your cards, gifts, and personal greetings were taken into my heart and strengthened me! God Bless you and this wonderful parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe!

We heard in the gospel today:

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: First, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew, the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

It is interesting in the text we heard from Matthew's gospel that only two are characterized when he names the Twelve. They are Matthew, identified as a tax collector, and Judas, the betrayer. Tax collectors usually were dishonest and out for wealth. Of course, betrayal is despised. But Matthew places himself with Judas. Both followed in grace. The difference is Matthew left his post and followed the humble Lord Jesus. Judas followed Jesus first in grace but then rejected the grace, which led him to turn Jesus into the authorities for money.

We can place ourselves with the Twelve and especially Matthew. We need grace and to follow the Lord. I hope grace takes root in our spirit like Matthew. We are to accept we are sinners. But Jesus still calls us to follow him.

The grace of prayer, compassion, and mercy keeps us close to the humble heart of Jesus. The Eucharist on Sunday, daily prayer, and giving ourselves to others is the way to stay in grace. We can easily turn from this path. The way is difficult and needs discipline, but we can do it!

The month that lay before us can be filled with distractions. The summer is a time to stay on the path. Take time for Sunday prayer and leisure time for the care of others. We could all use the identity of a tax collector to keep us humble.

I wish all of our beloved fathers a happy and holy Father's Day.

Please keep Sunday holy by participating in Mass and works of charity daily.

A special election will take place in Ohio on August 8, 2023 to vote on <u>Issue 1</u> which asks voters if Ohio should "Require that any proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Ohio receive the approval of at least 60 percent of eligible voters on the proposed amendment."



The Bishops of Ohio do not have a position on Issue 1 as it does not have moral content. However, as "responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation" (Faithful Citizenship, No. 13), the bishops urge Catholics in Ohio to register and vote in the special election.
