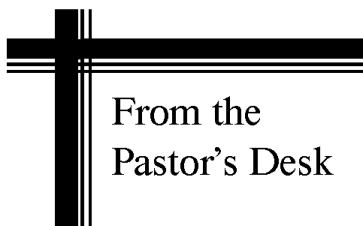

Dear Friends,

We hear today Jesus' acknowledgment of rejection in our midst:

Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures:

The stone that the builders rejected

has become the cornerstone;

by the Lord has this been done,

and it is wonderful in our eyes?
Therefore, I say to you,
the kingdom of God will be taken away from you
and given to a people that will produce its fruit." Mt
21, 33-43

Who likes rejection? No one! When we reject anyone, we are acting contrary to God. The kingdom is taken away from us when we reject because all are accepted in God's reign. This acceptance does not include sin. Sinful behavior is met by mercy and our willingness to do penance for our sins and the sins of others. Rejection results in division and sin.

Jesus' salvation is union and inclusiveness. This is one of the themes of a synod in Rome. Opening last Wednesday is a major month-long meeting in the Vatican, known as a **Synod**, that could chart the Church's future.

"Let us ask that the synod be a 'kairos' of fraternity, a place where the Holy Spirit will purify the Church from gossip, ideologies, and polarization," Pope Francis said, using the ancient Greek word roughly meaning an opportune or critical moment of significance.

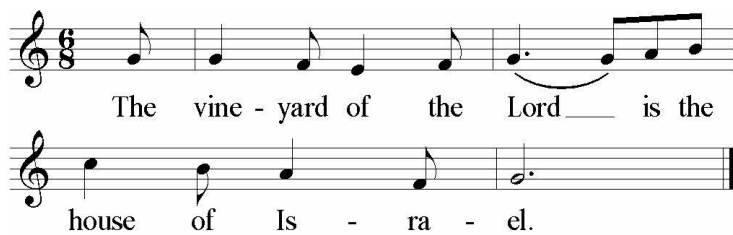
The Liturgy of The Word

*1st Reading Isaiah 5: 1-7

Let me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside; he spaded it, cleared it of stones, and planted the choicest vines; within it he built a watchtower, and hewed out a wine press. Then he looked for the crop of grapes, but what it yielded was wild grapes.
