

Dear Friends,

Once again, we hear Jesus teaching us in a parable:

"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son.

He dispatched his servants to summon the guests to the feast, but they refused to come.

A second time, he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast.'"

A recent wedding was exclusive and expensive. Only the "elite" were invited and could attend! The invited were deemed worthy and acceptable. Not with God! In another parable from Matthew, we are taught that "all" are invited, valued, and accepted at his wedding feast. But we are expected to attend. How can we refuse God? Our thankfulness and gift are expressed in prayer and love of God and our brothers and sisters.

We are gathered at the Lord's table every Sunday and share in the wedding of his Son. Our goodness shines, and our sins are forgiven. We celebrate God's mercy. We are wedded to God!

We are invited to show our love in the way we treat others. There is no elite class with God. Some may act like they are better and wear their righteousness in festive clothes, but all are equal. The poor, the rich, the young and old, the educated and sick are in union with the Lord.

And our concern is with all humanity. We are to care for those caught in war, like in the Ukraine and recently in the Middle East. Through missionary efforts, we are to feed those in our community and the poor in the poorest of countries. Come to the feast! Here, We find peace, unity, and union with God and his people.

REAL MARRIAGE: THE BEGINNING, THE MIDDLE, THE END—AND SO WHAT?

Tomorrow at 7 p.m. and on October 23 and 30, hear a series of talks on "Real Marriage." "The Beginning" will focus on issues that crop up before marriage and during the first few years: Is living together before marriage a good idea? What is intimacy, and how can a couple maintain its state of love? "The Middle" deals with the issue of children and chastity. How many children should a couple have? What about artificial birth control and its side effects? What about Natural Family Planning? What if one commits adultery? How should infidelity be handled? "The End" discusses how marriages end: divorce, dilemmas, and death.

Although divorce and dilemmas will receive some attention, most of the session will concentrate on the impending death of one of the spouses. What can we say about the passing of a spouse? What are some possible ways to view it and cope with it within the Catholic tradition? Finally, "So What?" covers the practicalities of marriage and strategies that work throughout all stages of marriage. How might problems be solved and gridlock overcome? How might the satisfaction that comes from marriage be maximized?

Talks will last approximately one hour, with opportunities to gather in groups and discuss issues afterward. Rev. **Gerald J. Bednar, Ph.D.**, will present the material. He taught theology at St. Mary Seminary for 31 years, has written a book about marital dilemmas (*Mercy and the Rule of Law*, Liturgical Press, 2020), and lectured on the *Book of Revelation* last year at our parish of Guadalupe.

Please make plans now to deepen our understanding of Marriage. We hope many young people contemplating marriage and our older married couples will attend!

Next Saturday, October 21, we celebrate the Anointing of the Sick and Eucharist at the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. All are welcome for this festive prayer. We ask our Lord to help us and show us all mercy.

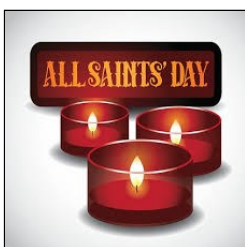
