We hear a parable today from Matthew concerning our need to always be ready for the Lord to arrive.

*At midnight, there was a cry,
'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!'
Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps.
The foolish ones said to the wise,
'Give us some of your oil,
for our lamps are going out.'
But the wise ones replied,
'No, for there may not be enough for us and you.
Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.'
While they went off to buy it,
the bridegroom came
and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him.
Then the door was locked. (Mt 25, 1 ff)*

The wise virgins held the light of Christ fueled by charity for the poor. The unwise thought they would enter the wedding because they could share the charity of the wise! We are **all** to practice charity if we enter into heaven. It is not good enough to sit and let others do the work of God!

In heaven, there are many doors into the wedding banquet. Those who open them are the Lord Jesus and his beloved poor. We enter because we are well known for our charity. Enter into compassion and mercy and we enter into the wedding banquet forever. Charity can be practiced in so many ways. Selfishness, complaining, and anger result in closing the doors to life. Our lamps are compassion, mercy and love for Christ and his poor. These allow us to approach the doors with courage!

As we approach the ending of our year, I invite you to prayer and charity. There are many opportunities to practice prayer at the Sunday Eucharist, in Advent as we prepare for Christmas, our festival of Our Lady of Guadalupe on the evening of December 11, with Bishop Amos presiding at Mass. Our MFTIN guides us in our charity and care for the poor. The Giving Tree is a way to heaven and the wedding feast!

Soon you will receive an email from me inviting you to pray, charity and financial support of our parish during the Advent and Christmas seasons. Please seriously consider participating fully in the life of our parish. Take an active role!
