John the Baptist is at the beginning of the gospel,  
 preparing us for the coming of Christ, Messiah, and  
 Saviour on the cross, abolishing our sins. We are to enter  
 into the starkness, the darkness of repentance, to turn  
 from separation from God, and enter the straight path of  
 Jesus. The Advent Eucharist prepares our spirits for  
 Christ's coming. The Baptist's words and example inspire  
 us as a faith community as God meets us with comfort and  
 peace.

Monday, December 11, we celebrate our patronal feast at  
 6.30 pm Mass with Bishop Martin Amos. You are all  
 cordially invited to the festive Mass and fiesta following.  
 Please come to celebrate with our young people and give  
 them hope through our presence on the feast of **Our Lady  
 of Guadalupe**.

Mary encountered the poor Juan Diego at Guadalupe long  
 ago, Jesus meets us now through our beautiful parish of  
 Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our focus for the coming years to  
 meet Christ is in the Sunday Eucharist. Our children meet  
 him through our PSR programs and youth ministry, and  
 Adults meet him in our varied educational opportunities.  
 Lastly, we meet him in our care for the poor ones in our  
 midst. Our Ministry For Those In Need projects, such as  
 the *Giving Tree*, are acts of charity and compassion. Christ  
 is present in these priorities as we go forward to our 60th  
 anniversary, which will be celebrated soon in 2027!

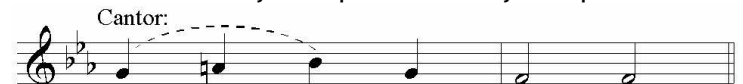

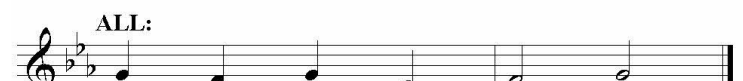

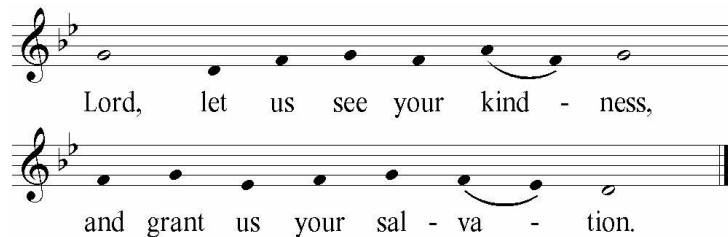
# The Liturgy of The Word

## \*1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the LORD double for all her sins. A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low; the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough country, a broad valley. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken. Go up on to a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news! Fear not to cry out and say to the cities of Judah: Here is your God! Here comes with power the Lord GOD, who rules by his strong arm; here is his reward with him, his recompense before him. Like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, and leading the ewes with care.
