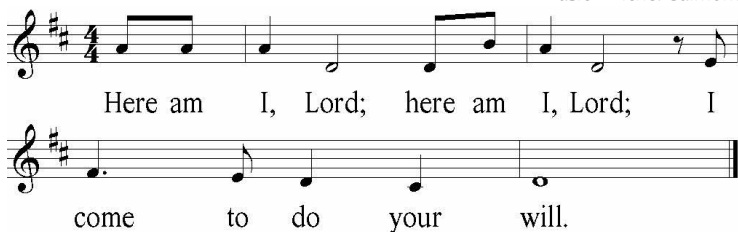
*1st Reading: 1 Samuel 3: 3b-10, 19

Let's come together and participate in meaningful service activities right here at OLG! There is so much good we can do for others right here at the church.

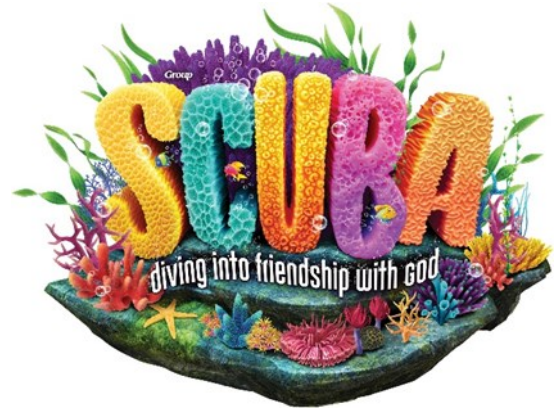
There are 3 activities we will be doing:

ASH WEDNESDAY MASSES FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday falls on February 14 this year. Masses
 with the distribution of ashes will be offered at **12:00
 Noon** and **6:30 PM**.

Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and
 abstinence in the Church. Since February 14 is
 celebrated by many couples as Valentine's Day,
 parishioners are reminded of the norms governing
 fasting and abstinence from meat since no dispensation
 will be given for this day which marks the solemn
 beginning of Lent. These norms are: *For members of
 the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are
 obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a
 person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two
 smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
 The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding
 upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14
 onwards.*
