I don't know if you know this, but I have it on pretty good authority that the Season of Lent starts seventeen days from today: January 28. Can you believe it? It seems like we were just preparing room in our hearts for the coming of our Savior and now we have to prepare our hearts for the wood of the Cross, though we all know that comes with the glorious ending of the Resurrection...or is it the glorious beginning?

We will also be offering a 12:00 Noon Mass on **ALL** the Tuesdays during Lent concluding on the Tuesday of Holy Week. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed on all Fridays (with the exception of Good Friday) at 7:00 PM. The Little Black Books will be available in the Narthex along with the Rice Bowls. As more information on anything "Lent" becomes available, we will certainly make announcements and print it in the bulletin.

Let's do all we can to make our Lent as joyful and positive as possible, not only for ourselves, but for each other, too. Through Lenten prayer, fasting, almsgiving, renewal, and repentance, we can truly celebrate Easter Sunday as a new beginning. Let us continue to pray for each other and for our wonderful parish while we are in this time of transition.

So, getting back to the you-know-who and all that stuff, we can say that each one of us is the you-know-who; renewing ourselves during Lent is the you-know-what; and the you-know-where is at Church, at home, at work, at school, at the store, and so on, and so on.

God bless you on your upcoming Lenten journey!

Oops, one last thing, the Feast of St. Blaise, *Bishop and Martyr*, falls on Saturday - February 3; Throats will be blessed at all weekend Masses on February 3 and 4. It will be done as a general blessing as part of the Final Blessing at the end of Mass.

ASH WEDNESDAY MASSES FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th this year.
Masses with the distribution of ashes will be offered at
12:00 Noon and **6:30 PM.**

Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence in
the Church. Since February 14 is celebrated by many couples
as Valentine's Day, parishioners are reminded of the norms
governing fasting and abstinence from meat since no
dispensation will be given for this day which marks the solemn
beginning of Lent. These norms are: *For members of the
Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory
from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted
to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together
are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence
from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic
Church from age 14 onwards.*
