Do you know when the last time Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day shared the same day? Well, it wasn't too long ago- 2018. But before that, the last time it happened was back in 1945. The only other time that they will share February 14 during this century is 2029. It really is a rare occurrence that these two well-known, yet seemingly different days on our calendar collide.

On Valentine's Day we shower our loved ones with gifts of flowers, candy, and cards to remind them of the special place they hold in our hearts and lives. On Ash Wednesday, ashes are placed on our foreheads to remember that Christ died for our sins as we repent for the sins we have committed. On the surface, the two days couldn't be more opposite. However, they might be more alike than we realize.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our Lenten journey to the cross. During this period, we look to Jesus on the cross as the greatest example of love. John 15:13 states, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." Love requires self sacrifice, because without that, is it truly love that we are experiencing? Jesus modeled this perfectly as he walked on earth but even more so when He gave up His life on the cross. The ashes that we will receive this Wednesday is love in the simplest form.

I'd like to share with you a couple of ways you might be able to bring love into your Lenten journey of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer.

The USCCB is sponsoring an in-home retreat for couples during National Marriage week that is happening now. The retreat is called Love Beyond Words and there is a link to the retreat on our website. The retreat is designed for you and your spouse to spend 10 minutes together each day to share in reflection and discussion about different topics.

I'd also like to invite you to experience Christ's love for us on the cross by joining me at a performance of Tetelestai this year. Last year, Our Lady of Guadalupe hosted 3 spirit filled performances of Tetelestai. My family and I are involved in the ministry again this year and would love to see you at one of our 5 venues across NE Ohio. This Wednesday, come together as a family to receive ashes on Valentine's Day and when the ashes are outlined in the shape of a cross on your forehead, remember Christ's love for us. Then, go out and share Christ's love with others.



 I am the Lord of the Dance, said he. (to Refrain)




