#### Bridesmaids:

List in order of procession Include any flower girls in this listing (not separately) Maid/Matron of honor should be the last person listed

### Groomsmen:

List in order of procession Include any ring bearers in this listing (not separately) Best Man should be the last person listed

Lectors: (Do not identify what they're reading, just list their names) Name of first reader Name of second reader Name of person reading petitions

### Presider:

The priest/deacon presiding at the ceremony

### Musicians:

List them by name, alphabetically This category is not essential Other things that you may wish to include in your wedding program are:

- 1 Where will you be having your receiving line?
  - If in church at the pew, ask them to remain in their pew following the ceremony, and you'll receive them there.
  - If at the reception, let them know not to expect one at the church.
- 2 A thank you to those who joined you in prayer at your wedding.
- 3 Your new address, phone number, cell numbers, e-mail address, *Facebook* page, etc.

# The Order of Worship

\*\*\* The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops requires that the following be included in wedding programs when a significant number of the participants at the wedding are of other than the Catholic tradition. Before including such in your program, please discuss its feasibility with the celebrant of your wedding.

**For our fellow Christians:** We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us *that they may all be one* (Jn. 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to holy communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (Canon 844.4). Members of the Orthodox churches, the Assyrian Church of the East and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of communion by Christians of these churches (Canon 844.3).

For those not receiving holy communion: All who are not receiving holy communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

**For non-Christians:** We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to holy communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and unity of the human family.
